For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

### **STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

1. You have the right to cancel this agreement for school, without any penalty or obligation, and obtain a refund charge paid through attendance at the first class session or the seventh day after enrollment whichever is later, less the application fee of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) and any applicable Fees for Kits/Supplies.

Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent to the School and directed to the address shown on the front page of this Agreement. A written cancellation, if mailed, is effective when deposited in the mail, and properly addressed with postage prepaid. If received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of money not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. If you cancel this agreement, the School will refund any money that you paid within 45 days after your notice is received.

2. All Kits/Supplies are deemed Non-Returnable and Non-Refundable due to the sensitive nature of beauty products; disallowing the School to issue returned products to another student
3. You have the right to withdraw from school at any time. If you withdraw from the course of instruction after the cancellation period as in Part 1, the school will remit a refund less a registration fee (not to exceed \$200.00) and Kit/Supplies Fees, within 45 days following your withdrawal. You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered and unreturned equipment. The refund shall be the amount you paid for instruction.
4. For the purpose of determining the amount you owe, you shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the course when any of the following occurs:
  - a. You should notify the school in writing of your withdrawal or the actual date of withdrawal;
  - b. The school terminates your enrollment;
  - c. You fail to attend classes for a THREE week period;
  - d. You fail to return from leave of absence.

In this case the date of withdrawal shall be deemed to be the last day of recorded attendance.

5. If any portion of your tuition was paid from loan proceeds, the refund will be sent to the lender or agency that guaranteed the loan. Any remaining refund amount will be first be used to repay any student financial aid programs (if any) from which you received benefits, to the extent of benefits received. Any remaining amount will be paid to you.
